It is with pleasure that at this time, I respectively acknowledge the moving services as provided by the North American Van Lines affiliate firm of F.R. Rush Transfer Ltd. of Charlottetown, PEI.

In the month of December of 1981, the firm of F.R. Rush Transfer Ltd. were contracted to effectively move the contents of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital Administration Headquarters; of Prince Edward Island Hospital (175 beds); Charlottetown Hospital (168 beds); Charlottetown Rehabilitation Centre (25 beds) and the Provinvial Laboratories to the new Queen Elizabeth Hospital a new facility of 352 beds which was scheduled for completion and occupancy by April 1, 1982. The move as planned was to be effected by reducing patient load and services in the acute care institutions so that one hospital would be moved in its entirety with the second unit to be moved as the new operation would permit.
